

ABC's for Canyon Hills' Parents

A – Attendance

- When a student is absent, call the school or have the student bring a note to the attendance clerk.
- For extended absences (more than 5 days and less than 21 days), the student needs to go on Independent Study. For more information, please talk to our attendance clerk.

B – Bus Conduct

- Students can be suspended from bus transportation and/or privileges forfeited if students act inappropriately on the bus.

C – Coyote Call

- The "Coyote Call" is a bi-monthly newsletter that will be updated on the school web site and also available in the school office. This contains information for parents regarding school activities.

D – Detection Canines

- The school district entered into a contract with Interquest Detection Canines Inc. to provide trained detection canines to conduct random, unannounced inspections of the high schools and junior highs.

E – Eligibility

- Students need to maintain a 2.0 GPA and have no more than 2 N's or U's in citizenship to participate in extra curricular activities.

F – Food Services

- \$2.05 for lunch per day; you can pre-pay for lunches in advance online through our district's website or at the school site.

M - Make-up Work

- For every day your student is absent, they are given one day to make up the work. (Ex. 3 days absent = 3 days to make up the work).

N - Nurse

- Check in all medications to the nurse.

O - Operation CleanSWEEP

- Canyon Hills is a member of Operation CleanSWEEP.
- Operation CleanSWEEP is a coalition of law enforcement, educators, and courts whose focus is to promote a safe learning environment for our children.
- The administration is trained to administer citations to students when other means of intervention have been exhausted.
- The citation is a Notice to Appear which lists the date, time and location of the incident as well as the specific crime itself.
- The juvenile citations will be heard by a Traffic Hearing Officer or Commissioner who will impose the sentence at the time of the hearing.

P - Progress/Report Cards

- Progress reports will be sent home via the students on: Oct. 10, Jan. 23, and May 1.
- Report cards will be mailed home at the end of each trimester: Nov. 26, March 13, June 12.

S - Student Dress Code

It is the intent of the Board of Education that students be dressed and groomed in a manner which will not interfere with or detract from a school environment conducive to academic learning or study, disrupt or threaten to disrupt the educational or instructional process, or create or present an unnecessary or unreasonable risk of injury or harm to any student.

- Shoes must have hard soles to protect the feet. Flip flops or flip flop-type footwear is not permitted.
- Absence of undergarments is not permitted. White undershirts are not to be worn alone as a shirt.
- Clothing which allows undergarments to be visually observed is not permitted.
- Bare midriffs are not permitted.
- Shirts and dresses must have sleeves or a sleeved top worn underneath.
- Shorts and skirts must be of a modest length ("finger tip rule").
- Clothing containing emblems, printing, lettering, or pictures pertaining to drugs, alcohol, sex or profanity is not permitted.
- Clothing or grooming that is obscene or defamatory, or that so incites students to create a clear and present danger of the commission of unlawful acts on school premises is not permitted.
- Jewelry which creates a health or safety hazard is not permitted.
- "Gang type" is not permitted. The determination of what constitutes gang attire may change and will be determined by the school and district administrators in consultation with local law enforcement agencies
- Body markings are not permitted.
- Accessories which advocate and/or cause disruption on campus and/or may provoke others to acts of violence or be used as weapons are not permitted.
- Only medically/religiously required hats/head coverings or unaltered school hats, as approved by the school principal are allowed.
- Sun protective clothing will be limited to site approved hats worn outdoors only.

T - Textbooks

- Each student is responsible for the textbooks issued to him/her. All textbooks must be covered. A student will be charged for books that are lost, damaged or indicated careless use and excessive wear.

U - Urge your student to get involved.

V - Vaccinations

- Keep your student's immunizations current.

W - Watch for sudden changes in your student's behavior.

X - Extra-Curricular Activities

- Encourage your student to get involved in clubs and activities.

Y - Yearly Calendar
